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Circuit Information



BAKU CITY CIRCUIT



The Baku City Circuit is a street circuit in the capital of Azerbaijan, which has hosted a Formula One race since 2016. It is 6,003 meters long, has 20 corners and is run counterclockwise.

The track is characterized by the long straight of just over two kilometers, while there are also several tighter corner combinations. This makes good brake balance crucial. The trickiest part of the track is the narrow passage near the castle. The narrowest stretch in this section is only 7.6 meters wide and makes the drivers feel as if the wall is closing in on them. Any small mistake here could mean an end of the race. After the castle are several high-speed turns and the drivers come out on the start-finish line. The chances of overtaking are highest here due to the slipstream possibilities.

CIRCUIT INFORMATION

COVID-19

There are currently no coronavirus-related entry requirements for the Azerbaijan Grand Prix.

Getting There

Baku is a street circuit, so chances are your hotel will be within walking distance of the circuit if you are staying in the city center. However, public transportation is an excellent alternative.

During the Grand Prix weekend, metros and buses leave every few minutes in the direction of the circuit's various entrances. Metro stations 28 May, Sahil and Icheri Sheher are all within walking distance of the track.

Food and Drinks

Several food and drink stands can be found throughout the circuit. Typical choices in the Fan Zone include kebabs, pizza, hot dogs, shawarma, ice cream, and soft drinks, while restaurants and bars in the area sell a variety of national cuisines and alcoholic beverages.

Toilets

Restrooms are located throughout the track. Pay attention to the signs directing you to the nearest restroom.

Walking Distance

Visiting a Grand Prix often involves a lot of mileage. Be sure to wear comfortable shoes for all the walking required of you, and wear comfortable clothing.

Taking Pictures

Taking photos is allowed, but only with a simple camera. Attention will also be paid to obstructing the view of other spectators. The enjoyment of other spectators should not be interfered with by anyone, so we advise spectators to always pay attention to others.

- ID proof and entrance ticket;
- Sun protection;
- Sturdy walking shoes;
- Hearing protection;
- Photo camera incl. extra battery and memory card;
- Your printed ticket.

Climate

The race takes place in Baku in late April/early May. During this period temperatures average between 15°C/59°C and 21°C/70°C. There may be some rain. We also recommend to bring slightly warmer clothes for the evening when the sun goes down and it gets cooler.

Toegangscriteria voor het circuit

In case you are wondering whether something is allowed or not, please refer to the list below. All unauthorized items must be dropped off at the circuit entrance gates. Circuit staff have the right to add other items to the list.

- Food and drink; except baby food and an empty clear plastic water bottle of max. 100 ml;
- Dangerous items;
- Drugs;
- Alcoholic beverages;
- Harmful and flammable substances;
- Fireworks, smoke bombs, rockets, laser pointers, stadium horns;
- Aerosol cans (deodorant, mosquito repellent, etc.).
- Bags or backpacks larger than 15 liters; Luggage and trolley;
- Cans, metal and glass bottles;
- Flagpoles and umbrellas;
- Vehicles (bicycles, scooters, etc.)
- (Domestic) animals;
- Professional cameras or video cameras;
- Tents and sleeping bags;
- Electronic cigars/cigarettes;
- Chairs and stools.
