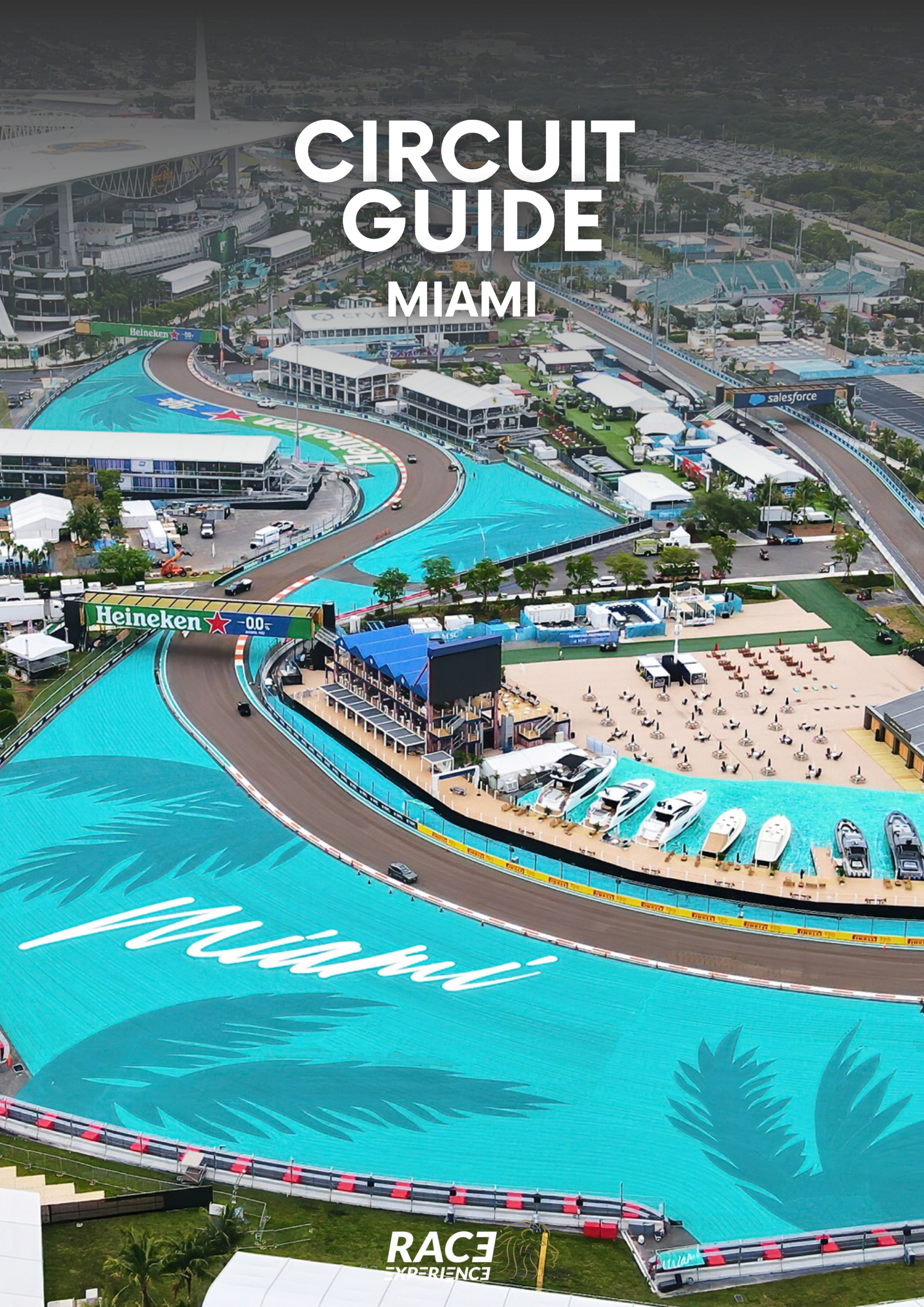

ABOUT THE CIRCUIT



The Miami International Autodrome is a 3.41-mile, 19-turn circuit located around Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens, Florida. The track was designed for Formula 1 and was first used for the Miami Grand Prix in 2022. The circuit has a mix of fast straights and tight corners, which makes for exciting racing. The pit lane is long and narrow, which may require additional pit stops. The Miami Grand Prix is a popular race, with many fans coming to watch the action.

Some interesting details:

- The track was designed by Tilke Engineering, the agency also responsible for circuits such as Sepang and Yas Marina.
- The pit lane is 375 meters long, which is one of the longest in Formula 1.
- The circuit has a DRS zone on the start/finish straight.

HOW DO I GET TO THE CIRCUIT?

There are several ways to get to the circuit.

With public transport

Take the Metrorail to Earlington Heights Station, followed by the Metrobus number 297 to Hard Rock Stadium. Or get off at the Brownsville and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Metrorail stations and take the same bus service. Dedicated shuttles to the Miami Grand Prix are also expected to be available on race weekend from the closest Metrorail stations.

With the cab

Taxis, as well as rideshare services such as Uber or Lyft, are easy to find in Miami. Please note that during the Miami Grand Prix weekend the roads are extra busy and taxis charge higher prices.

ENTRANCE GATES

We recommend that you use the [interactive map](#) of F1 Miami. This way you can clearly see which entrance is closest to your Grandstand.

OPENING HOURS

Miami International Autodrome opens and closes on the following days at the following times.

Friday

- Open from 11:30 a.m.
- Closed from 8:00 p.m.

Saturday

- Open from 10:00 a.m.
- Closed from 7:00 p.m.

Sunday

- Open from 10:00 a.m.
- Closed from 7:00 p.m.

PRACTICAL

SANITARY FACILITIES

There are sufficient (temporary) toilets available on the circuit. Look out for signs directing you to the nearest toilet. In general, the toilets are kept very clean. The toilets can be very busy during a Grand Prix weekend, especially right before a Formula 1 session.

FOOD & DRINKS

Many local and internationally renowned restaurants will participate during the Miami GP. Keep in mind that Miami is known for its high food and drink prices. It is not allowed to bring your own food and drinks.

WALKING DISTANCE ON CIRCUIT

During a Grand Prix weekend, expect plenty of walking. Hence, opt for comfortable shoes and attire to avoid blisters and discomfort. Pick clothing that allows easy movement, ensuring you can fully enjoy the event.

TAKING PICTURES

It is allowed to take photos on the circuit with a simple camera for personal use. Pay attention to other spectators and avoid obstructing their view. Be respectful to fellow Formula 1 fans.

WEATHER AND CLIMATE

At the beginning of May, Miami blossoms with wonderfully warm weather and a lively atmosphere. Temperatures rise to 29°C. The chance of rain is 60%, with short, heavy showers that can color the afternoon or evening. The sun shines 9 hours a day, with a high UV index, so sun protection is very important.

F1 FAN ZONE

Miami Circuit is divided into eight zones, including an artificial marina complete with docked superyachts and a beach zone with a swimming pool. Each zone has entrances and exits, restrooms, food and beverage outlets and booths with merchandise. Not every zone is accessible to everyone.

ENTERTAINMENT & ACTIVITIES

This year, Ed Sheeran, Steve Aoki and Don Omar will be performing at the Hard Rock Beach Club. The performance is visible from the stands, but if you want to get closer you will need to purchase tickets.

The circuit staff reserve the right to add other items to the list. Your cooperation is appreciated to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all visitors.

PROHIBITED TO TAKE WITH YOU

- Alcoholic beverages
- Cans, metal and glass bottles
- Drugs
- Food and drink
- Electronic cigars/cigarettes
- Dangerous objects
- (Pets
- Harmful and flammable substances
- SLR cameras or video cameras
- Aerosols (deodorant, mosquito repellent, etc.)
- Chairs and stools
- Bags or backpacks larger than 15 liters; luggage and trolley
- Tents and sleeping bags
- Flagpoles and parasols
- Vehicles (bicycles, scooters, etc.)
- Fireworks, smoke bombs, rockets, laser pointers, stadium horns
