

So you might be planning to go to the British Grand Prix and wonder which tickets you should get. Then this ticket tip guide might help. Here we will provide you with useful tips when selecting tickets for the Grand Prix.

Besides this there is a short overview per grandstand to give you an idea of what the views are with different ticket options. Good luck selecting your tickets. If there is anything you need help or support with, don't hesitate to reach out!





01. TICKET TIPS

To help you select the right tickets and get you well prepared for your trip to the British Grand Prix, we have compiled a few ticket tips:



If you purchase tickets for the same grandstand and for the same days in one order, you are guaranteed to sit together.



All grandstands at Silverstone provide visibility on a big tv-screen. About half of the stands (the more expensive ones) is covered.

During the first two days of the event, all grandstand tickets are free roaming. This means you can view all grandstands (except Club Corner, Hamiltons Straight A and Abbey B). Keep in mind that the most popular grandstands fill up quickly. Especially on Saturdays. On Sundays, you must sit in your assigned seat.

We offer you the possibility to add various extras to your order. For instance parking ticket, inner track access, after party tickets and more). You can order these extras in combination with an entrance ticket or a British Grand Prix package. Please contact us if you wish to add any services to your Silverstone venue tickets.








02. GRANDSTAND TICKET TYPES

The British Grand Prix at Silverstone is one of the most iconic, popular and best attended races on the FORMULA 1 calendar. Unfortunately, tickets do not come cheap. Despite the elevated prices, the British Grand Prix is nearly sold out each year.

Below you will be able to find an overview of the different types of tickets which are available at the Silverstone Grand Prix. Along with this you can find information on the views that the different tickets offer and if it is worth the price you pay for it.

GRANDSTAND TICKETS

NATIONAL PIT STRAIGHT GRANDSTAND

The National Pit Straight Grandstand is near the old Start-Finish and before the Copse Corner. A big advantage is that this grandstand is covered and elevated. Therefore, you will have a panoramic view from Luffield to Copse Corner. Additionally, you overlook the paddock of the support classes like Formula 2 and Formula 3. Altogether, it's a comfortable spot to enjoy the racing spectacle.

STIRLING A / B

From the two, Stirling B will have a better view of Copse corner. You will be able to see the cars coming from Woodcote into the high speed corner Copse.

CLUB CORNER GRANDSTAND

The Club Corner grandstand is located at the final corner of Silverstone. This corner leads to the International Pits Straight. It's a solid and popular choice, with four sections. Section 2 offers the best tickets, closest to the pit boxes. These seats provide excellent views of the podium celebrations after the race.



ABBEY A / B

The Abbey grandstand is located at the end of the International Pits Straight. This is right next to the opening bend Abbey. From here, you have a broad view of the last corner, Club, pit stops, start/finish of the race, Abbey, and Farm. The grandstands are similar, however, Abbey B offers a slightly better view of turn 1.

THE VIEW GRANDSTAND

The View grandstand offers an excellent view of the first corners. You'll have a clear sight of race starts and the pit lane exit. It's an outstanding grandstand at the Silverstone circuit.

FARM CURVE

Farm Curve is positioned between the View and Village grandstands, situated at turn 2. From here, you can enjoy a fantastic view of turns 3 and 4. This makes it one of the better grandstands at the Silverstone circuit.

VILLAGE 1/2

The pricier and covered Village 1/2 grandstands provide a great and close-up view of the F1 cars. Here you will see drivers tackling the challenging and slow Village and Loop corners. Additionally, it's a short walk to the Village podium. Here are concerts during the Grand Prix weekend. The cheaper Village A is also an excellent choice, offering views of a large TV screen.

LUFFIELD GRANDSTAND

The Luffield grandstand is located at turn 7. This provides a fantastic view of this long, sweeping corner. Although it's on the pricier side, it's definitely worth the investment.

WOODCOTE

Woodcote, located at turn 8, offers views of turns 6 and 7 due to its relatively high position. These turns follow Hangar Straight, the first DRS zone at the Silverstone circuit. It's one of the cheaper grandstands at the British circuit.

COPSE GRANDSTAND

The Copse grandstand is positioned at turn 9. This is one of the fastest corners at the Silverstone circuit. Notably, it's where the infamous collision between Lewis Hamilton and Max Verstappen occurred. This was in 2021, do you still remember? With a direct view of this rapid corner, it's an exceptional spot.



CHAPEL

Chapel is the last grandstand in the Maggots and Becketts corner combination. Located at turn 14, you can witness cars approaching from turns 12 and 13.

VALE GRANDSTAND

The Vale grandstand is located at turn 16. It offers a fantastic view of corners 16, 17, and 18. It also provides a clear sight of the pit lane entrance to follow live race strategies. It's one of the cheaper grandstands at the Silverstone circuit.

LANDOSTAND

Another impressive grandstand is found at Stowe corner. This is of the fastest corners at Silverstone. Drivers approach Stowe at speeds exceeding 300 km/h from Hangar Straight before navigating it in 4th or 5th gear. There are three grandstands to choose from offering views of this spectacular corner. Previously, these grandstands were known as Stowe A, B, and C. However, from 2025, these stands will be the Landostand A, B, and C.

The considerable runoff areas near Stowe, with distant view of the track, are not a problem. In fact, it provides a fantastic panoramic view of the circuit. We recommend Landostand A and Landostand B. From these grandstands, you observe drivers continue through Hangar Straight and Stowe. Right towards Vale and the circuit's final corner combination.



HAMILTON STRAIGHT A / B

Hamilton stand A is the main grandstand of the Silverstone circuit, and therefore also the most expensive. The grandstand is covered and mainly provides a view of the last few corner combinations, the pitlane, and the pitboxes from the slower teams.

Hamilton B is not covered. Due to the Red Bull hospitality your sight on the last few corners would be limited. The grandstand is located right on the start / finish line which gives you a great view of the start of the race and turn 1. Besides this, you will also get a great view of the pitboxes of the top teams.

BECKETTS GRANDSTAND

Becketts grandstand is a covered grandstand. It is located opposite the unique Maggots and Becketts corner combination. From this spot, you can witness the cars tear through Maggots and Becketts. Just before drivers continue towards Hangar Straight. While the Becketts corner combination isn't known for overtaking, it's one of the most spectacular sections on the calendar. This premium grandstand also provides views of corners 4 and 5 at the circuit's start. Here, Max has demonstrated overtaking isn't a challenge, as Charles Leclerc discovered in 2019.



SILVERSTONE ON A BUDGET

If you would like to go to the Silverstone GP on a budget, you should order General Admission Tickets. Below you find information about what to expect.

The variety of General Admission zones at Silverstone is considerable. This somewhat justifies the relatively high ticket prices. These areas cover nearly the entire circuit perimeter. You will have excellent viewpoints at some of the best corners. In many cases, these areas are located directly in front of the grandstands.

In recent years, organizers have invested in improving the standing experience. By increasing capacity, constructing raised viewing mounds, and relocating some barriers. This is all to bring fans closer to the action.

Some of the best viewing areas in the General Admission zones at Silverstone include:

- The International Pits Straight (overlooking the start/finish line)
- Stowe
- Luffield
- Becketts
- ✓ Vale
- Copse Corner

It's crucial to secure your preferred spot as early as possible. On Saturday and Sunday popular areas, especially Vale, fill up quickly.
